Topic of Sermon: *Joy in Fellowship/Community*

Main Passage: Acts 2:42-47

What's the Big Idea?

The proper setting for "unstoppable joy" is in Biblical community.

Get Started

- Describe a time when you experienced joy in community with others.
- What are some ways you have brought joy to others?

Dive into the Sermon

- From the passage in Acts 2, Jonathan Scott mentioned that the early church had 4 priorities (teaching, fellowship, breaking bread together and prayer). Which of these brings you the most joy and which one is most lacking in your life?
- Jonathan indicated that those 4 priorities brought about 4 impacts resulting in joy. (Filled with awe, shared possessions, diligent single-minded gathering and joy expressed in sincerity) Have you ever experienced community like that described in the Acts 2 passage and by Jonathan? In what ways? Do you think that type of community is still possible today? Why or why not?
- Read Phil. 2:1-8. It seems to indicate that it is available to all who follow Jesus. What keeps us from community like this?
- Read 1 John 1:1-4. What might be some outcomes as a community of followers of Jesus if this passage characterized our lives?





Dig Deeper into a Scripture Passage

Use the HEAR Bible Reading Method to learn more what the Bible teaches us about joy.



Bible-Reading Tip: Begin by asking God to open your eyes and hearts to His Word. In 1 Corinthians 2:6-16, Paul writes that the Spirit – who lives inside everyone who believes in Jesus – knows the depths of God and reveals Him to those who follow Jesus. So, always begin your time of reading the Bible with a prayer for Him to open your eyes and ears to what He will reveal. This doesn't mean that you will always have an emotional encounter or a special revelation, but you are acknowledging that He is that One through whom all wisdom is revealed.

Psalm 133:1 (CSB)

"How good and pleasant it is when brothers (& sisters) live together in harmony (community)."

Additional Scriptures: John 17:20-23; Philemon 1:4-7

HEAR Bible Reading Method

HIGHLIGHT the passage

- Underline any repeated words or key ideas you see.
- Note any questions you have about what you read.
- In 2-3 sentences, summarize what was said or what happened.

EXPLAIN the passage

- What was revealed about God? His character, desires, and/or actions?
- What was revealed about people? What we are/do or what we should be/do?

APPLY the passage

- From this reading, what truth do you need to embrace?
- By God's power, how will you THINK, SPEAK, or ACT differently based on what you read?

RESPOND to the passage

- Talk to God about what you've seen and learned in this passage.
- Ask Him to help you apply the truth to your life.
